

GOD ENTERING AND TRANSFORMING OUR TERRAIN THROUGH MARY

We celebrate a New Year, and the final day within the octave of Christmas. Why do we have eight days? Why not just one day for Christmas? For the Jewish tradition, there is a significance for eight days. God created everything on six days and consecrated it all on the seventh day. But after the sin of Adam and Eve, something much more is needed. The eighth day points to the need for a new creation, and the eighth day became of sign of a new creation for the Jewish people.

That is why we have an octave of Christmas. The birth of Christ brings about a new creation. It is therefore perfect that the eighth day of Christmas is actually the new year! We celebrate a new year by celebrating the new creation that Jesus initiates.

We especially celebrate Mary today because she had an important role in this new creation. Jesus was not simply biding his time for thirty years until He began the work of redemption through his public ministry. He was performing the work of redemption by being born as a child through a human family, with a human mother that was destined to become the mother of the children of God.

This being born of a child through a human family raised many questions theologically for the early Church. They were trying to process everything that took place. We essentially have this solemnity of Mary Mother of God because of hersey known as Nestorianism that was creeping in the early Church.

A little history on this matter: Nestorius became bishop of Constantinople in 428. A rash and dogmatic man, Nestorius quickly got himself in trouble with Cyril, the bishop of Alexandria. He preached, toward the end of his first year in office, a sermon attacking the view that the Virgin Mary is properly called theotokos, "mother of God," and suggesting that she should instead be known as the "recipient of God." The underlying issue in this sermon was christological. The issue was this: if you say that Mary is the Mother of God, it means that she gave birth to God, which means that God is not eternal. The debate between Nestorius and St. Cyril of Alexandria came to a head at the Council of Ephesus (431),

Out of this debate came a proper articulation of irrefutable truth about Jesus: We do not say that the eternal Word became flesh by having his nature changed. We instead say that in an unspeakable and incomprehensible way, the Word united to himself human flesh.

The Incarnation means that the humanity and divinity of Jesus are distinct, but not separate from each other. Mary did not give birth to a human being only, and then the divine nature of Jesus jumped in and united itself. The Divinity of Jesus is united to the Humanity of Jesus without altering the divinity. The Word does not transform itself, but unites itself to flesh through the Incarnation. It is that truth that we can say that The WORD became Flesh. God became flesh without changing who God is. But by taking on flesh, He did transform Fleshly existence.

What does this practically mean? Jesus is in the flesh. God is in the flesh.

Do we trust that. Common error - God has his terrain, and we have ours. We can control and manipulate the flesh, reality, as it were.

Do we believe that the cosmos, all of reality, has truly been transformed by the Incarnation? If so, do we see our current situation as redeemed, transformed, made anew? Do we see our current situation as a manifestation of God's fleshly presence here and now?

Even in their holiness, Mary, Joseph, and their child Jesus were not exempt from suffering, and the difficulties of life. Yet they never wavered in their commitment to God or to each other. Theirs was a home where the child [Jesus] grew and became strong, filled with wisdom; and the favor of God was upon him. Let us strive to make our homes a haven for others to grow in love, virtue, and favor.

In the first reading, Abram puts his faith in God's promise of a child despite his and Sarah's old age. In the second reading the author emphasizes all that Abraham did was by faith. In the Gospel, Joseph and Mary present Jesus at the temple, and meet Simeon and Anna who prophesy about the child.
