



LIKE THE MAGI ADORING CHRIST AS VICTOR OVER THE WORLD

Who indeed is the victor over the world but the one who believes that Jesus is the Son of God?

As Christians, as Catholics, we can claim victory because Jesus himself has conquered the power of the world and its desires through his death on the cross. We share in this victory through our faith in him.

We claim victory because of what the Son of God has done for us in the flesh. What He has done is died for us on the cross - what he has done is shed his blood so that we are made clean. This is what God has done for us in the flesh.

We find many attempts to create a Christianity that is divorced from the reality of the flesh. A Christianity that seeks to dominate rather than surrender to the will of the Father. A Christianity that replaces truth with sheer will to power. A Christianity without discipleship. A Christianity without the Cross.

We are seeing this fake Christianity unfold in our times today. Because of this, authentic discipleship seems to face two attacking fronts - the unrelenting ideology of secularism on one side, and the nihilistic retaliation (of this 'fake' Christianity) on the other.

What are we to do?

Testify to the victory that we have already received. Claim this victory as our own. Claim Christ's Victory by claiming His Cross.

LITURGY OF THE WORD

With Christ's help we can be his light for others.

We are not the source of the light that a world in darkness needs desperately. Instead, we must receive Jesus, the Light of the World, so that we can in turn share it. And as we heard in the first reading: Then you shall be radiant ... your heart shall throb and overflow. Jesus has come to give all the love we need, all the wisdom called for, all the virtue necessary to be a light to others.

In the first reading, the prophet Isaiah promises that Jerusalem will be a light for all nations. In the Letter to the Ephesians, Saint Paul explains the revelation that the Gentiles are members of the same body of Christ. In the Gospel, magi from the east look for the newborn king, finally finding the child with his mother, Mary.



EPIPHANY OF THE LORD

The word "epiphany" comes from the Greek epiphainen, a verb that means "to shine upon," "to manifest," or "to make known." Thus, the feast of the Epiphany celebrates the many ways that Christ has made Himself known to the world, mainly the three events that manifested the mission and divinity of Christ: the visit of the Magi (Matthew 2:1-12), the baptism of Jesus (Mark 1:9-11), and the miracle at Cana (John 2:1-11).
