Confirmation as the Sacrament of Growth

What do we need in our bodily life? If we think about it, we need to be born, we need to grow, we need nourishment, and we need healing when injured. Without these things, we would die. The truth is that we need the same in our spiritual life... We need to be born (Baptism), we need to grow (Confirmation), we need nourishment (Eucharist), and we need healing from injuries (Reconciliation and Anointing of the Sick). Just as we need growth to strengthen our natural life, we need Confirmation to strengthen our supernatural life.

Therefore, Confirmation is the sacrament of growth. It is not Catholic Bar Mitzvah. Confirmation is not a "coming of age" celebration. The Sacrament of Confirmation is not a rite of passage, nor a graduation from religion class, nor a ratification of a personal faith choice. But unfortunately, many Catholics misunderstand Confirmation and treat it like a right of passage, a graduation, a 'coming of age', and a personal faith choice. All of these ideas of Confirmation are wrong.

Rather, Confirmation is all about what God is doing for his beloved daughters and sons. What is God doing?

Strengthening the divine life which he gave at Baptism so that we can grow in holiness.

CONFIRMATION AS A SACRAMENT OF FORTITUDE

What does this growth look like? St. Thomas Aquinas (+1274) relates the 7 sacraments to the 7 virtues (4 cardinal virtues and 3 theological virtues). But what are these 7 virtues, and what are cardinal and theological virtues?

The Cardinal Virtues are natural and acquired virtues. This means that we have to work for these virtues. It requires energy and effort. One does not necessarily have to be a Christian to have these virtues, but the graces given in baptism enable one to flourish more easily in them. The cardinal virtues are prudence, temperance, fortitude, and justice.

The theological virtues let us act upon God. Just as little children cannot hug their parents unless their parents pick them up and hug them, we need God to do the same for us to act upon him. These are infused virtues given by God, and one has to be a Christian to have these theological virtues. They are faith, hope, and charity.

Specifically fortitude is the virtue by which we do the right thing in the midst of hardship - doing the thing that we do not feel like doing. Fortitude does not mean not having fear, because having no fear would make the task easy. Having no fear is brashness, not fortitude. Fortitude is doing the right thing *while* experiencing fear.

Why does Thomas Aquinas associate the Cardinal Virtue of Fortitude with Confirmation? The strengthening of the divine life given at baptism enables us to be courageous in the faith amidst hardship. When we face challenges in life and our faith is tested, we need God to give us courage to persevere in the faith. Yes, an atheist can have fortitude in natural matters, but the Christian seeks fortitude in spiritual/supernatural matters as well. And so, God has given us this great sacrament so that we receive the strengthening and growth needed to be brave and persevere in the faith.

All in all, let us congratulate Brianna and Chloe for receiving this great sacrament of growth and fortitude!
